



## S.1 Puts West Virginia's Elections at Risk

---

*S.1 would cancel West Virginia's election safeguards and rewrite the rules of voting, risking chaos, confusion, and fraud.*

### UNDERMINING VOTER CONFIDENCE IN WEST VIRGINIA

- West Virginia Secretary of State Mac Warner [voiced](#) deep concerns about S.1 when he testified in the Senate. Warner even explained how S.1 risked making it harder for members of the military to vote.
- Fifty-four of West Virginia's 55 county clerks [recently](#) signed a letter voicing their grave concerns with S.1.
- West Virginia's voter ID law would be effectively canceled.
- S.1 would force West Virginia to allow unrestricted ballot trafficking by political operatives. West Virginia has safeguards that make this practice illegal. They would be eliminated by S.1.
  - West Virginia only lets people collect two ballots. Under S.1, operatives could collect unlimited numbers of ballots.
  - S.1 forces communities to let political operatives and activists collect ballots without supervision.
  - In the past, operatives and activists have abused their access to intimidate voters and destroy ballots.
- S.1 would force West Virginia to adopt [same day registration](#). Election officials would have little to no time to verify information, jeopardizing election security.
- S.1 would severely hinder West Virginia's ability to keep its voter registration lists clean and accurate. Ineligible voters would remain on the rolls, presenting opportunities for fraud.

### AN UNCONSTITUTIONAL FEDERAL TAKEOVER OF ELECTIONS.

- As S.1 advances to a vote in the Senate, the left is continuing its push to weaken election safeguards and implement an unprecedented and unconstitutional takeover of our elections.
- Progressive activists want to take election administration out of the hands of Arizonans and send it to career politicians and bureaucrats in Washington.
- Recent polling confirms that S.1's core policies are deeply unpopular. Most Americans want to *add* safeguards to voting, not take them away.
- S.1 would impose reckless policies that put trust in elections at risk, from eliminating voter ID laws to making partisan ballot trafficking legal in every community.
- In fact, S.1's mandates are so sweeping, election officials have voiced grave concerns. It risks chaos, confusion, and fraud.
